



BRUSH PICK UP PROGRAM:

1. Brush pick up will be limited to no more than a pile sized 12' long by 8' wide by 6' high at any single residence. Residents/Maintenance crews who exceed this limit will be responsible for disposal
2. All brush must be cut in no more than 8' lengths with all limbs trimmed from branches and stacked in an orderly manner. Diameter of branches or trunks should not be more than twelve (12") inches. Pick up will be approximately every seven days.
3. This program was designed as residential pick up for routine maintenance by residents and for storm damage only. This program was not designed for tree removal.
4. All materials generated for tree removal will be the responsibility of the homeowner/contractor for disposal.
5. Any person found dumping brush on road right-of-way, not generated from adjacent property, will be fined for illegal dumping.

GRASS:

Loose grass and clippings on road side **MUST BE BAGGED**. Please inform your lawn service of this change. The City will not be responsible for damage to lawns due to material left on road side not bagged.

ITEMS THAT CANNOT BE PICKED UP:

Construction or Remodeling materials such as:

- Lumber or Plywood, painted or unpainted, treated or untreated.
- Carpet, Padding, or any flooring.
- Shower stalls, bathtubs, commodes, cabinets, sheetrock, paint, etc.
- Chemicals of any kind.
- Tires
- Batteries

The above list of items must be taken to Santek Disposal at the Estill Springs transfer station.

This may not be all items as listed. This list of items is subject to change and other items may be added as necessary. FOR ANY QUESTIONS CALL 967-3596 prior to placing items at roadside.

WINCHESTER'S BLUE BAG RECYCLING PROGRAM

Recyclables are picked up at curbside every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month.

Material Collected:

PLEASE collect each item separately in a blue bag: Blue bags are free for City of Winchester residents and can be picked up at Winchester City Hall or Winchester Public Works.

- **Aluminum Cans**
- **Metal Food Cans**
- **#1 (PET) Plastic** - Soda Bottles & Food Containers
- **#2 (HDPE) Plastic** - Milk & Detergent Bottles
- **Newspaper**
- **Cardboard** - Packing Boxes or Food Boxes
- **Mixed Paper** - Colored Paper, Stationery, Notebook Paper, Magazines, Catalogs, Phone Books, white ledger paper

Preparation of Materials

- **Aluminum Cans** – Rinse cans, aluminum foil, pie pans, etc.
- **Tins Cans** - Rinse before storing. Some examples are corn, green bean and soup cans. **NOTE:** The labels do not have to be removed. The end of the can does not have to be removed. Crushing can is optional.
- **#1 (PET) Plastic** - Remove the lid and rinse the container. Some examples are 2-liter drink bottles, peanut butter jars and other #1 plastic bottles and jars with the Recycling triangle with a 1 inside.
- **#2 (HDPE) Plastic** - Remove the lid and rinse contents from the container. Some examples are milk jugs, bleach and detergent bottles, and other #2 plastics bottles and jugs.
- **Corrugated Cardboard Boxes** need to be free from excessive dirt. All Styrofoam and plastic must be removed from the boxes. Try to prevent the boxes from getting wet. Breaking down the box is optional.

Special Waste

Waste Oil - Used oil is collected for recycling at various Convenience Centers and at Franklin Co. Solid Waste Management located on Joyce Lane in Winchester. (Limit 5 gallons per person per day)

Waste Antifreeze - Used Antifreeze is collected for recycling at various Convenience Centers and at Franklin Co. Solid Waste Management located on Joyce Lane in Winchester.

Construction and Demolition - The City of Winchester cannot pick up any of these items. Please contact Santek Disposal.
